## THE FIRST LESSON— Revelation 7:9-17

After this I, John, looked, and there was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, robed in white, with palm branches in their hands. They cried out in a loud voice, saying,

"Salvation belongs to our God who is seated on the throne, and to the Lamb!" And all the angels stood around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshiped God, singing, "Amen!

Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honor and power and might be to our God forever and ever! Amen."

Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, "Who are these, robed in white, and where have they come from?" I said to him, "Sir, you are the one that knows." Then he said to me, "These are they who have come out of the great ordeal; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb.

"For this reason they are before the throne of God, and worship him day and night within his temple, and the one who is seated on the throne will shelter them. They will hunger no more, and thirst no more; the sun will not strike them, nor any scorching heat; for the Lamb at the center of the throne will be their shepherd, and he will guide them to springs of the water of life, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes."

#### THE PRESENTATION AND EXAMINATION OF THE CANDIDATES

The Congregations remains seated during the presentation.

*Celebrant:* The Candidates for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

*Presenters:* I present N. to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

*The Celebrant then asks the Parents and Godparents:* 

*Celebrant:* Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is brought up in

the Christian faith and life and will you by your prayers and witness help

this child to grow into the full stature of Christ?

Parents: I will, with God's help.

Question: Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel

against God?

Answer: I renounce them.

*Question:* Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy

the creatures of God?

Answer: I renounce them.

*Question:* Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God:

Answer: I renounce them.

Question: Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior:

Answer: I do.

Question: Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

Answer: I do.

*Question:* Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?

Answer: I do.

All stand, as able. The Celebrant addresses the entire Congregation:

Celebrant: Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these

children in their life in Christ?

People: We will.

THE BAPTISMAL COVENANT

*Celebrant:* Let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew

our own baptismal covenant.

*Celebrant:* Do you believe in God the Father:

People: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Celebrant: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God:

People: I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.

He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit

And born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, Was crucified, died, and was buried.

He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again.

He ascended into heaven,

And is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

*Celebrant:* Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit:

People: I believe in the Holy Spirit,

The holy catholic Church, The communion of Saints, The forgiveness of sins,

The resurrection of the body,

And life everlasting.

Celebrant: Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of

bread, and in the prayers?

People: I will, with God's help.

Celebrant: Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin,

repent and return to the Lord?

People: I will, with God's help.

*Celebrant:* Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

People: I will, with God's help.

*Celebrant:* Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as

yourself?

People: I will, with God's help.

*Celebrant:* Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the

dignity of every human being?

I will, with God's help.

#### PRAYERS FOR THE CANDIDATES

Let us now pray for these children, who are to receive the Sacrament of new birth.

*Intercessor:* Deliver them, O Lord, from the way of sin and death.

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

*Intercessor:* Open their hearts to your grace and truth.

## THE THANKSGIVING OVER THE WATER

Celebrant: The Lord be with you.

People: And also with you.

Celebrant: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: It is right to give God thanks and praise.

The Celebrant blesses the water.

#### THE BAPTISM

The candidates are baptized in the name of the Trinity.

I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen**.

The candidates are marked with chrism, an oil blessed by the Bishop for use at Baptism. You are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own forever. **Amen**.

Candles lit from the Paschal Candle is given to the newly baptized as a symbol of our Baptismal Ministry to carry the light of Christ into the world.

Receive the light of Christ.

## Let us pray,

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy spirit you have bestowed upon these your servants the forgiveness of sin and have raised them to the new life of grace. Sustain them, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give them an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. **Amen.** 

#### THE WELCOME
